Come to the Annual Meeting in order to vote upon important updates/clarifications to Association Bylaws

The Annual Meeting of the West Main Hill Neighborhood is scheduled for **May 28th at 6:30 PM in the Olmsted Room at Kalamazoo College**. The Board of Directors recommends that the Bylaws and Articles of Incorporation be clarified and updated to: (1) Make clear that volunteer Directors and Officers are not liable for mistakes they may make as long as they acted in good faith. (2) Make more clear that voting membership is limited to residents of the neighborhood who are at least 21 and that non-voting membership is available to others whose application for membership is approved by the Board. (3) Permit official notice to Directors and Members to be given by email. (4) Make more clear that a Director must be present at a meeting where a vote is taken in order to vote. (5) Make explicit that Directors and Members should not vote or participate in deliberations when they are financially or otherwise impacted by the outcome in a significant and quantifiable way. (6) Make clear that information obtained by a Director as a Director is confidential and should not be disclosed to non-members unless the Board decides otherwise.
